The United Methodist Women at FUMC want to thank everyone who brought gifts for the Christmas Store at the Cookson Hills Center which ministers to the Native American people in rural Oklahoma. Inez Stone and Carol Sherer took the many new gifts that had been loaded into the church van to Cookson Hills on Tuesday, October 29. Rev. Judy Deere, the Director of

Cookson Hills, and her husband helped unload the van. They were thrilled with all the items that were brought. Rev. Judy Deere said that they were expecting to help over 150 families this year. These very low-income families put in an application in November and are given a date to come to the Christmas Store. Families are allowed to shop for one gift item per family member at a minimal cost. Children are allowed one clothing item and a toy. Volunteers then wrap the gifts for the families to take home. Each family also receives a box of food. The UMW appreciates everyone who brought gifts!



#### What Difference Does It Make? Challenge

How often do you spend \$5 and not miss it? A cup of coffee? A small tip for a server? A couple gallons of gas? Parking? For many people, spending \$5 here and there doesn't make a major impact in their budget or in their standard of living. So, what if you increased your giving to First Church by just \$5 a week? Would you even miss it?

Your \$5 a week might not make a difference to you, but if all 318 people/families that give to First Church every year increased their gifts by just \$5 a week, it would add up to \$82,680 a year. That makes a big difference!

Challenge: As you make your annual increase in giving to First Church, you are challenged to take it a small step further. Commit an extra \$5 a week (or \$260 a year) in addition to whatever increase you are making. For some \$5 isn't enough. Maybe you wouldn't even notice \$10 or \$20 a month. Challenge yourself to go just a bit further to find the amount that may not make a difference to your bottom line but would make a significant impact in God's Kingdom.

**Guarantee:** At the end of 2020, if giving that little extra has had a negative impact on your financial health or if you haven't seen the benefit it's made in the church and community, we will return that gift to you. The overall purpose of this challenge is to enrich your life and the life of your faith community, not create more stress.
