I am not a person who is comfortable with chaos. Can I be messy from time to time? Of course, just stop by my office. But when it comes to mountains of laundry and minefields of legos, I get completely overwhelmed. If we are talking about our "brick and mortar life", where our faith is the mortar that holds the bricks of our lives together, my home bricks are gratified with crayons and spaghetti sauce.

I know (hope?) that I am not alone. Even if you don't have small children bringing a sense of chaos to your home and family, you probably have your own brand of unmet expectations or uncontrollable factors to deal with. Magazines, Instagram and HGTV tell us that our homes are meant to be immaculate and beautiful, our families warm and well-behaved, and our friendships bountiful and meaningful. I strive for this, and yet this projected perfection is simply unattainable. And that's ok.

As we reflect on our "brick and mortar life", we have to ask, where is our focus? It is not the breadth of our social group that reflects our importance in this world, it is the depth of relationships where God's love can live and flow. When we allow the mortar of our faith to bring strength and propose to our homes, our expectations shift and our lives change. This is what we are seeking this month as we examine the bricks and mortar of our home lives.

A few nights ago I heard a sound coming from my 3 year old's room at 10 p.m. When I went to check on him, I found him sitting on the floor organizing his toy cars. I lost it. This was the third night in a row he refused to go to sleep. I yelled, I cried, and I firmly tucked him into bed. His big eyes and stunned silence was all I needed to understand that I had gone too far. So I took a breath and climbed into bed with him. I didn't know what to say, so I started with, "I'm sorry", a phrase I planned to quickly follow with "but..." as I explained the many reasons he deserved my harsh words and behavior. Before I could get it out of my mouth, he laid his head on my chest and reached for my hand. I closed my mouth, took a breath, and accepted the extraordinary gift of grace he gave me. A grace that was extended both from his small, sticky hand and the strong, loving hand of God.

World Hijab Day Celebration with Islamic Center 8:30-10:30am, FirstCup Café, Come and Go


