ATTENTION PARENTS. We understand that worshipping with children can be an adventure, but it is an essential part of their growth in Christ. If your child is staying in worship, we have busy bags hanging on the hooks just outside both entrances. The narthex is the entrance from Center street and bags are located to the left as you enter. The other entrance, from the hallway behind the sanctuary, has bags as well. The nursery is located next to the sanctuary and can be reached by exiting the short staircase on either side of the stage and turning left. After the children's sermon, children ages 4 through 1st grade are dismissed downstairs to the children's department for supervised fellowship time. They may be picked-up after worship. Children 2nd grade and above are invited to remain in worship with their families.
