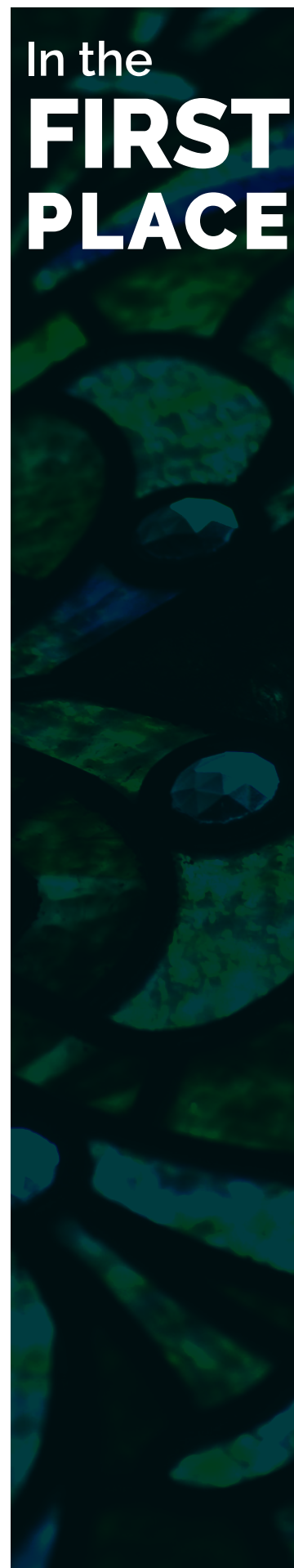

REJOICING IN BAPTISMS

We have been blessed at First Church over the last months to celebrate quite a few baptisms. This singular moment in the life of a Christian is the recognition of God's profound, ever-present grace. This grace is just as present for an infant as it is for an adult which is why we celebrate the sacrament of baptism for all ages. As we splash the water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we rejoice in the transformational love that is at work in every moment and at every stage of life. I like baptisms, if you can't tell.

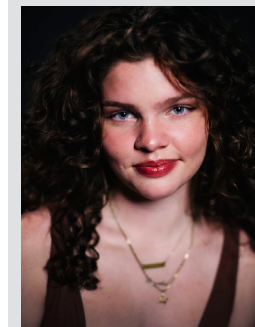
One of my favorite parts actually happens before anyone gets wet. After sin is renounced and faith professed, the pastor turns to the congregation and asks them to make a commitment. The pastor asks the congregation to love, care for, teach, pray over, and worship with the person being baptized. This promise is an essential part of the baptism as it recognizes that a life of faith is meant to be lived in community. When someone is baptized they are not just being recognized as beloved children of God, they are also being welcomed into the church family. There is power in this moment, especially when make this commitment to the baby in the arms of the her parents. We look to that young family, just starting an incredible, challenging journey and say, "You don't have to do this alone, we are here for you!"

This is not a small promise that we make and yet I worry that at time we are unsure of how we can fulfill it. Over the last weeks, as I have moved into the position of Pastor to Kids and their Families, I have begun to realize the multitude of ways that we can uphold our promise to love and support our youngest disciples. It is not all about teaching Sunday School (don't get me wrong, we need Sunday school teachers), but there are many opportunities for you to be a part of lives of the kids in our congregation. We need people who can rock babies in the nursery on Sunday. We need people who can help prepare our spaces for lessons and activities. We need creative minds who can help plan engaging and meaningful events. We need organized people who can help make our space more functional. We need hospitable people who can welcome families with a warm smile. We need people who can provide encouragement and wisdom to weary parents. And if you none of these opportunities sound right for you, we need patient, loving church friends who can lend a smile to the crying baby in the sanctuary or who can lead a lost family to the Children's Area.

In the weeks to come we will have more baptisms, more smiling families, more curious kids, more congregational promises. Next time you proclaim "We Do!" when asked if you will support and love the child being baptized, I hope you will take an extra moment to consider what this commitment means. After you do, if you want to chat with me about ways you can be a part of the faith journeys of our youngest disciples, I'm easy to find. Give me a call, send an email, stop me on a Sunday because being a part of the lives our kids isn't just important, it's super fun!

Dear First Church,
After further consideration and consultation with health professionals, the Board of Stewards has made another change to our COVID protocols and mask policy. We will continue to follow the Community Levels defined by the Center for Disease Control. However, we are changing our mask requirements in the various Community Levels.

Our masking recommendations will be as follows:
High (Orange)= Masks required
Medium (Yellow)=Masks recommended
Low (Green)=Masks recommended

We hope this change will provide more physical comfort in worship and other activities while remaining cautious and responsible. We will still require masks and vaccinations for those working directly with children under 5.
