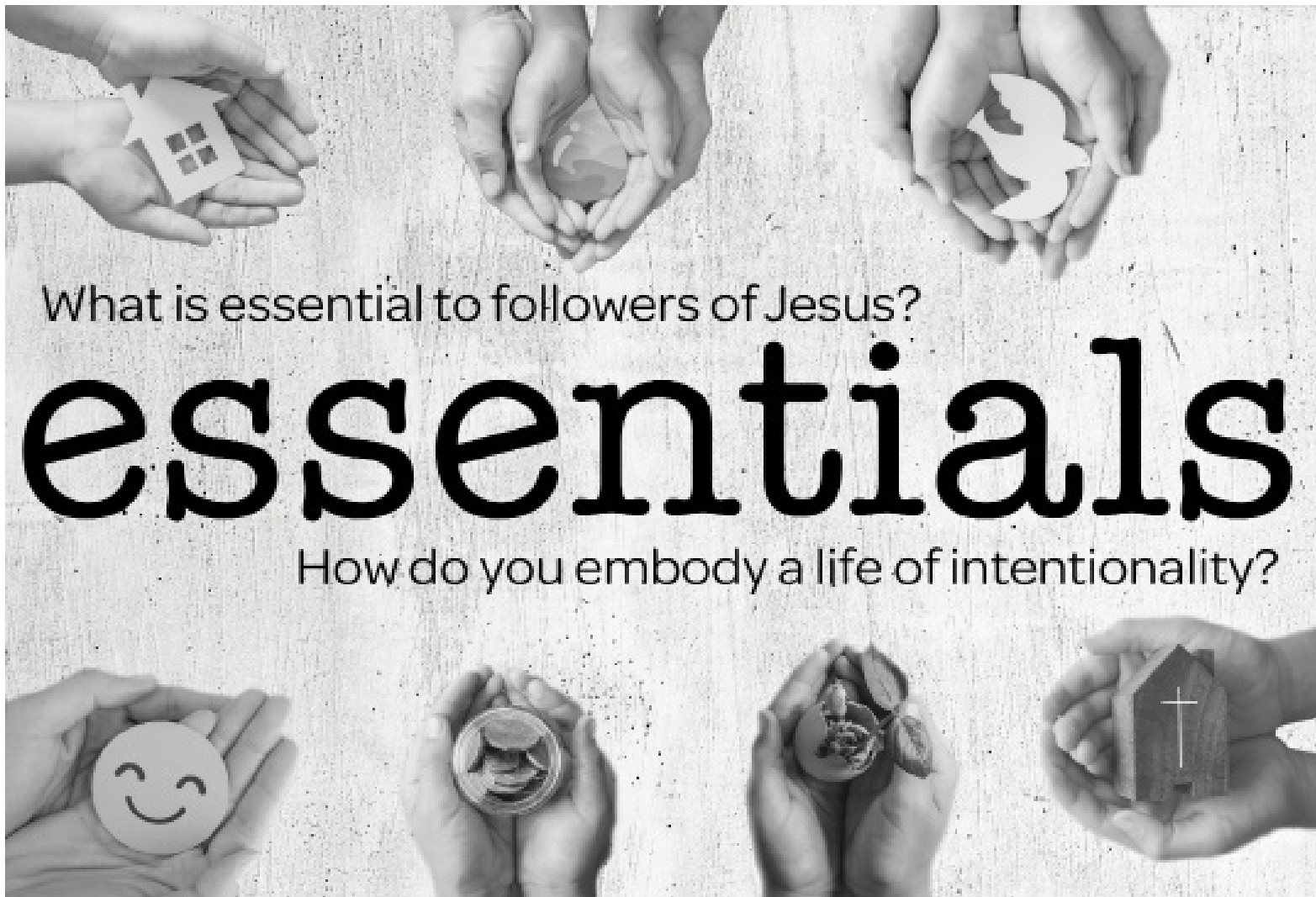

# In the FIRST PLACE

Dear First Church,

I have been praying for you and your families during this Omicron surge. May God surround you with protection, health, healing, and strength. Thank you for your understanding and willingness to shift our worship services to online-only this past Sunday. Circumstances forced us to make those decisions very late in the week, and the process was made easier knowing that our congregation has embraced the fluidity of these times.

The Board of Stewards met Monday night and decided to suspend all in-person activity through the end of January. Our Sunday morning worship services will stream just as they do every week at 9:00 am and 11:00 am. A list of other online opportunities is printed below.

I share in your disappointment and frustration that our progress is not linear, and we have to take a break from our in-person connections. However, projections about the longevity of this surge are shorter than we've experienced in the past. I am very hopeful that we will be back to in-person gatherings after just a few weeks. In the meantime, please pray for all of those contracting COVID, the medical personnel caring for our communities, and those who are most vulnerable. Check on one another and make sure we all remember we are cared for, supported, and loved. God is with you, and God's grace is sufficient.

## MUSIC MINISTRY

Yesterday, as my four-year-old son was taking a bath, he started making up a song to entertain himself. This, by itself, is not remarkable; there isn't a kindergartener alive who doesn't sing their own theme music. However, I managed to catch a snippet of his lyrics as I was washing and sanitizing the day's bottles for our infant, and he was repeating the phrase "Newtonian... Newtonian... non-Newtonian fluid..." over and over again as he splashed in the tub.

Now, I'm fairly certain that he has no idea what a non-Newtonian fluid is: he was bathing in plain water, after all, not oobleck or whatever. But he obviously had picked the term up at some point and liked how it rolled across his tongue as he said it. Fair enough; however, when he gets older he and I are going to have a little chat about viscosity and the nature of matter and why you can't just throw the term "non-Newtonian fluid" around in the bathtub.

I wonder about us, though... the church, that is. It's easy enough to forgive a child for singing a silly song and not really knowing what his words mean, but when was the last time you really paid attention to the words in our hymnal? When we get to the line, "Here I raise my Ebenezer, hither by thy help I'm come," do you ever sit and ruminate on exactly what those words mean? All too often we gloss right over them and keep going. It's not just hymns, though; we do the same thing with prayers, creeds, and litanies. It's all passive participation. In this coming year, I challenge you to think critically about the words we use in worship, both spoken and sung. You might find a greater sense of depth. You may discover a few new favorite songs. You may also discover that a hymn you used to love doesn't quite live up to your memory... but let's not throw the baby out with the bathwater.
